EXPOSURE VISIT TO WELFARE AGENCIES- 2026



Child Care Institution (CCI) & Special Adoption Agency



Special Observation Home

The **Department of Social Work** organized an educational Exposure Visit for newly admitted students (**BSW & MSW**) 1st year to various welfare and rehabilitation agencies. The **objective** of the visit was to provide students with practical exposure to various welfare agencies. The visit helped students understand the structure, functions, available resources, funding sources, and services etc. of these organizations. It also provided an opportunity to observe how different agencies work for the welfare, protection, and development of The Society.

During the visit, we explored various child welfare institutions under the Child Welfare Committee (**CWC**), including the Child Care Institution (**CCI**), Specialized Adoption Agency (**SAA**), and **Special Observation Home**. We also visited **DAPTA**, a welfare agency. The officials and staff members warmly welcomed us and provided detailed orientation sessions on the functioning and services of these organizations.

At the Child Care Institution (CCI), the staff explained about the facilities available for children, government tie-ups, rehabilitation processes, and the overall management system followed in the institution. They also shared several case studies and clarified the queries raised by the students regarding child welfare and protection mechanisms.

In the Specialized Adoption Agency (SAA), students learned about the legal adoption procedures, documentation process, counselling services, and the role of agencies in ensuring safe and ethical adoption practices.

The staff members of the Observation Home explained the functioning of the **Juvenile Justice Board (JJB)** and its coordination with the **Child Welfare Committee (CWC)**. They discussed the intervention process for children in conflict with law, counselling methods, therapeutic approaches, rehabilitation procedures, and special observation services provided to juveniles. Real-life case studies were also shared to help students understand the practical challenges and responsibilities involved in social work practice. The programme became highly informative and interactive as the staff members, CWC representatives, and officials actively interacted with the students and addressed their questions.

The exposure visit was attended by **faculty members Ms. Subhashree S. Konhar, (Principal I/C) Ms. Monalisa Sahoo (Lecturer in Social Work), and Mr. Pramod Jani (Lecturer in Social Work) along with the students of the Department of Social Work**. The visit provided valuable field experience and enhanced the students' understanding of child welfare administration, rehabilitation services, and professional social work intervention.

Rangon Ka Utsav Holi- 2026

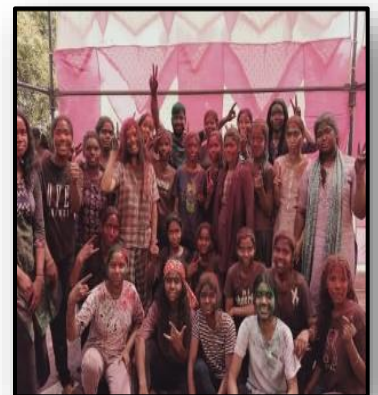
"Where colors meet smiles, beautiful memories are created."
